Ia. Please send the following **CINEMATOGRAPHIC** (**VIDEO**) **FOOTAGE** of the horse moving on a flat and hard (e.g. grippy asphalt or firm grass) surface:

- Walking in hand on a loose lead (straight line).
- Trotting in hand on a loose lead (straight line).
- Upper and lower flexion testing of all four limbs (if applicable/feasible).

Ib. Please send the following **CINEMATOGRAPHIC** (**VIDEO**) **FOOTAGE** of the horse moving on a flat and soft (e.g. arena) surface:

- Longeing (or free longeing) in both directions at a walk, trot, and canter (if applicable/feasible).
- II. The following RADIOGRAPHIC STUDIES of the horse (at minimum):
 - Dorsopalmar (DP) and lateral views of each front foot; 4 images total.
 - Medial and lateral obliqued views of each thoracic fetlock; 4 images total.
 - Medial and lateral obliqued views of each pelvic fetlock; 4 images total.
 - Lateral and lateral obliqued views of each tarsi (hock); 4 images total.
 - Lateral and caudocranial views of each stifle; 4 images total.
